Examples of straightforward sentence-level approaches for improving critical writing. These examples are based on responses to George Orwell's *Animal Farm* and will need to be adapted.

Points to consider when using this resource

This approach can work well within the context of retrieval practice, perhaps as a starter task within lessons. Repeated practice is recommended so that the approaches become very familiar. Some students may benefit from a vocabulary task such as a *Zone of Relevance* before applying the vocabulary within this context.





Doubling

Model adding an extra adjective or noun to increase the precision of the statement.

Napoleon is a brutal tyrant who uses fear to crush dissent.

Napoleon is a brutal and unforgiving tyrant who uses fear and manipulation to crush dissent.





Under the rule of farmer Jones, all animals lived in harsh conditions.







Say three things

Model using lists of three adjectives or nouns to ensure precision and depth of detail.

Squealer is a manipulative character.

Squealer is a manipulative, controlling and charismatic character.





Modify and expand

Model using adverbial modifiers to expand descriptions Snowball is a more lively, original and intelligent pig than Napoleon. *mentally lively, politically original and strategically intelligent*

Napoleon is cowardly, calculating and selfish.

physically cowardly, politically calculating and unrelentingly selfish
